

2023 Annual Report Introduction

The Long Distance Trails Crew (LDTC) is an all-volunteer group of women and men who devote time and effort to the betterment of hiking trails in New York & New Jersey, west of the Hudson River, mainly the Appalachian Trail, the Long Path, the Highlands Trail and the Shawangunk Ridge Trail.

As a "crew", the LDTC takes on technical projects involving the design and installation of stairways, crib-walls, drainage features, stepping stones, bridges and treadway.

In 2023, the LDTC was involved with four major projects:

- 1) Completed and opened phase 1 of a relocation of the Appalachian Trail on Surebridge Mountain in Harriman State Park.
- 2) Started phase 2 of a relocation of the Appalachian Trail on Surebridge Mountain in Harriman State Park.
 - 3) Refurbished bog bridging on a section of the Appalachian Trail in Kloiber Field.
 - 4) Began major reconstruction of the New York Long Path on Tallman Mountain.
